Final Views — From the Desk of Dr Aditya Vijay Kashyap

Markets are navigating a complex mix of policy noise, geopolitical friction and uneven macro data. The short-term outlook is dominated by headline risk — trade rhetoric and policy announcements — which can trigger swift volatility. For disciplined investors, we recommend focusing on: (1) high-quality companies with resilient cash flows; (2) selective exposure to financials and defensive consumer names in India given recent flows; (3) monitoring credit spreads closely and avoiding levered credits where liquidity is thinning. Maintain a balanced approach, keep liquidity buffers, and use volatility to rebalance toward long-term allocations rather than chase momentum. — Dr Aditya Vijay Kashyap
